Criteria

Criteria for Eligibility:

- Must be an undergraduate degree-seeking student.
- Must have a minimum of a 3.0 GPA (based on USW hours completed unless a freshman or transfer student)
- Some scholarships may have additional criteria for eligibility. The Office of Financial Aid will determine which scholarships applicants may be eligible.

Criteria for Acceptance:

- Required to submit a written thank you note to the Development Office within two weeks of receiving award.
- Must maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA while receiving the scholarship.
- Scholarship funds may only be used for tuition and required fees.
